

# Fringed Scarf

## Made of Plymouth Eros or Halcyon Dazzle (the ladder yarns)

Use single strand (pictured below) or double strand of yarn. Single strand produces an open, airy look that has a spring to it and double strand makes a beaded, more opaque look.

**Needle size:** #15 US

**Single:** Use one ball of Dazzle or divide one ball of Eros into two balls before cutting fringe.

**Double:** Two balls of Dazzle (take even amount from each ball for fringe) or divide one ball of Eros into two balls after cutting fringe.

**Both scarves:** Cut 20 (more or less, if desired) strands of yarn 12" long as directed above. Cut so "step" of the ladder is at each end, not the thread.



**Both scarves:** Cast on 12 stitches. Continue in garter stitch until yarn is gone. Cast off. Add fringe by using a crochet hook (any size that suits) to pull the middle of the strand through the edge (cast on and cast off sides). Line the two ends up even and gently pull through the loop and tighten gently. Continue at even intervals between stitches.

### Look Ideas

- The single strand is light enough to tie as a headband around hair with fringed-ends hanging down your back.
- Both scarves work as belts. The single tends to be stretchy, but the double has more weight for draping.
